



## Alliance Mining Reports Surface Sampling Results On Several New Gold & Base Metal Properties

### NEWS RELEASE

**Kamloops, BC** — Alliance Mining Corp. (“Alliance” or the “Company”) is pleased to report results from initial rock sampling programs on four new Arizona mineral properties that were acquired between September and December 2007. (Please refer to News Releases dated September, 28 and November 8, 2007) The sampling programs consisted of taking 34 chip and grab samples from the Twin Eagle Mine, Breccia Zone, Quartz Mountain and Boston Arizona Mine properties.

Nine samples were taken from the Twin Eagles Mine property in and around old mine workings. Assays ranged from 0.41 grams per tonne (“gpt”) gold, up to 20.73 gpt (0.65 troy ounces gold per ton ) and 3.3 gpt silver to 206 grams silver (6 .6 troy ounces silver per ton) with trace to 0.47 % copper, zinc values from 549 ppm to 2.8% and lead values 133 ppm to 2.8%. The nine samples averaged 5.2 grams gold per tonne (0.15 oz) and 74.2 grams (2.17 oz) silver per tonne.

Eighteen samples were taken from a few of the Boston Arizona Mine workings. Historic reports states the mine produced zinc, lead, gold, silver and copper from an adit that accessed several stations and drifts. The surface samples taken by Alliance returned trace to up to 1.71 gpt gold, trace to 12.5 gpt silver. Copper values returned up to 3% , lead values returned up to .37% and zinc values returned up to .6 % . The average copper grade of the eighteen samples was 0.4 % .

Five samples were taken from the Quartz mountain property. Samples reported from trace to 2 gpt gold, trace to 19.7 gpt silver. Copper values up to .42% and averaged 0.19% . Gold values averaged 0.68 gpt.

Two samples were taken on the newly acquired Breccia claims which are located between our Gold Pit Property and Gold Chest Property. These claims have now joined both properties into one contiguous property which is now referred as the Gold Chest Property. The Gold Pit Mine and Breccia claims will be referred to as the “Gold Pit and Breccia zones within the Gold Chest Property. Gold values of 0.98 and 0.289 gpt and silver values of 16.4 and 12.2 gpt, were returned. Lead values averaged 0.8 % , and zinc values averaged 0.51% . These values support the assumption of a large polymetallic trend running through the Gold Chest Property south to the Gold Pit mine area.

*Jan C Ross, President of Alliance Mining, stated “This small sampling program will assist us in designing and prioritizing exploration programs to fast track to the drilling and delineation stages. We are very happy with these surface results and look forward to seeing what lies below the zones of mineral leaching. Three of these properties meet our criteria for drilling to find and delineate any higher grade zones of mineralization that may be amenable to extreme gravity processing. The Quartz Mountain Property will need additional geophysical work in order to locate any drill targets”*

The Company's strategy is to concentrate on mining districts hosting hundreds of smaller, higher-grade mineralized zones. These targets will be delineated and any economical zones be mined collectively and processed centrally using extreme gravity processing methods. Alliance is presently focused on the Placerita Project, a group of primarily gold properties in Yavapai County, Arizona
